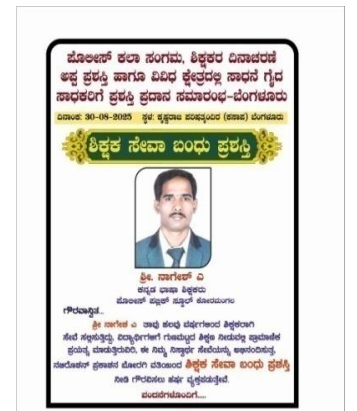
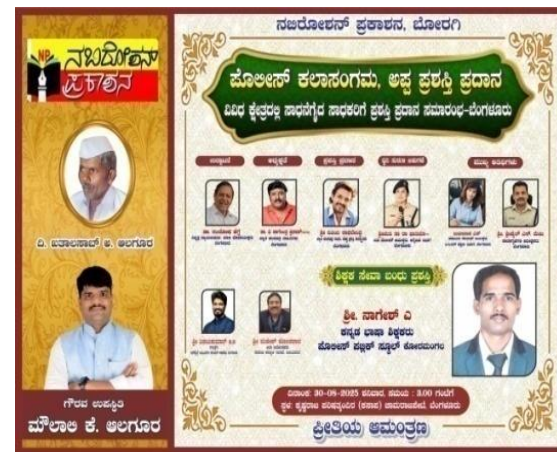


## Vocational Voyage: Career Counseling
