Under-17 Kabaddi Teams Shine at Independence Day Cup

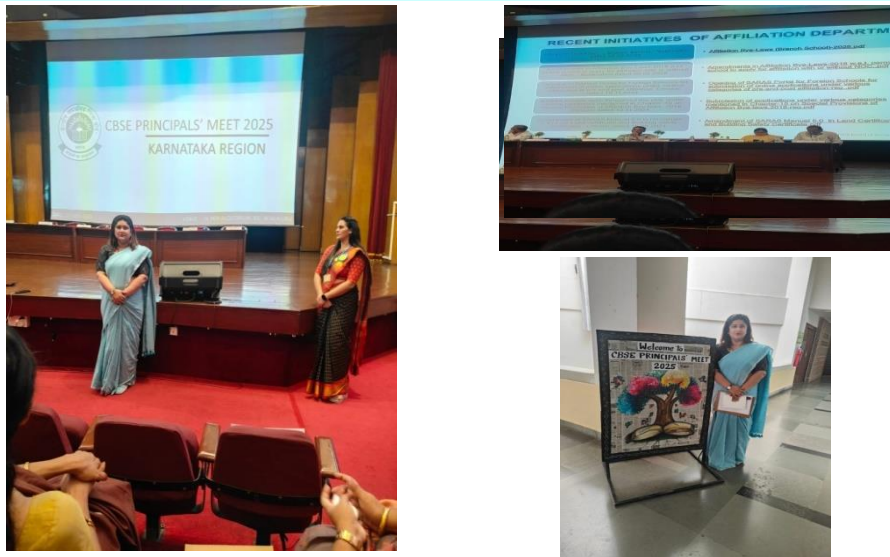
