Faculty Training Program

The Management of Police Public School, Koramangala, Bengaluru organized an emphasizing Teacher Empowerment Programme. A four days Faculty Training Workshop was held from 27th May, 2025 to 30th May, 2025 at Police Public School.

The workshop was designed to enhance the professional skills and teaching methodologies of faculty members. It included sessions of 21st Century Skills; Promoting Student Engagement in classrooms; AI Tools and computers and Professional Ethics and values. The Orientation Programme commenced with a formal Inaugural Ceremony. The event was graced by Shri. Deepan M. N., IPS, DIGP, KSRP and Secretary, PPS; Shri.
