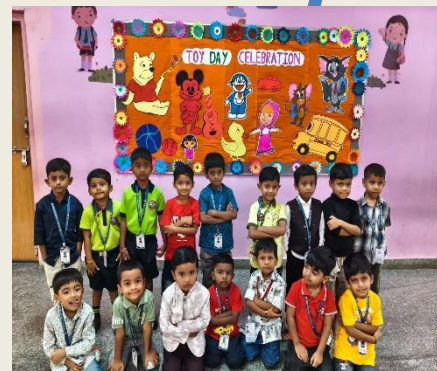
Remembering the Spirit of Freedom

The sessions are held from 3:10 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. after regular school hours. Teachers provide focused attention to students and use simple, engaging and activity-based methods to address individual learning needs.

In English, students are given opportunities to improve their reading, writing, vocabulary, grammar and comprehension skills. In Mathematics, emphasis is placed on strengthening number concepts, basic operations, problem-solving skills and understanding mathematical concepts through practice and activities.

The remedial programme is designed to help students overcome learning gaps, improve their academic performance, and develop greater confidence in their abilities. With regular practice and individual guidance, the classes aim to ensure that every child receives the support needed to progress steadily in their learning journey.

Learning Science Through Experiments

The Science lab Examination for class 9 was conducted on 31st August. The examination provided students with an opportunity to demonstrate their practical knowledge, laboratory skills, and understanding of scientific concepts.

The students performed the assigned experiments carefully and followed the necessary laboratory procedures and safety guidelines. Their participation reflected their preparedness, confidence, and interest in practical learning. The examination was conducted smoothly and successfully under the guidance of the Science teachers.
